

## **Glossary of Terms - Officer Mobile**

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| TERM                   | DEFINITION   |
|------------------------|--|
| Activity               | An event or series of events with which security personnel<br>may become involved. When a dispatcher creates a record<br>for an activity, it becomes a <b>dispatch</b> . Once the dispatch is<br>closed, it's moved to Perspective as an activity record.  |
| Call Sign              | A pre-configured code to help dispatchers easily identify<br>officers. All officers must be assigned a call sign when they're<br>brought on duty.  |
| Dispatch (activity)    | A security-related event that requires the attention of an<br>officer. Once a dispatch is created, a dispatcher will create<br><b>tasks</b> for an officer to complete as part of that dispatch.<br>When a dispatch has been closed, its record is transferred to<br>Perspective as an activity.   |
| Dispatch (application) | <ul> <li>A desktop application designed to work with Officer Mobile</li> <li>and Perspective that helps security departments manage</li> <li>activities and the officers who respond to those activities.</li> <li>Dispatch tracks locations, categories, priorities, officer status</li> <li>and actions, and any other important activity details.</li> </ul>                                  |
| Dispatcher             | A user running the Dispatch desktop application who is<br>responsible for taking calls, creating dispatches and tasks,<br>and managing and assigning officers.   |
| Dispatch Administrator | The user who creates and configures user profiles, zones and teams, RTAs, and locations.   |
| Indoor Location Point  | A location saved within in a larger location (a <b>master</b><br><b>location</b> ). For example, an indoor location point could be a<br>meeting room inside an office building, while the office<br>building is the master location. Indoor location points are<br>created and configured by a Dispatch administrator and, if<br>selected on a dispatch, appear in the <b>Dispatch Details</b> . |



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| Master Location         | A larger location that contains <b>indoor location points</b> . For<br>example, an office building may be a master location, while<br>the meeting rooms in the office building are the indoor<br>location points. Master locations are created and configured<br>by a Dispatch administrator. |
| Officer                 | A security personnel representative who is dispatched and responds to dispatches and tasks created in Dispatch.   |
| Off Duty                | When an officer is no longer working and cannot be assigned tasks. Officers can be taken off duty by a dispatcher or through the <b>Profile</b> component of Officer Mobile.  |
| On Duty                 | When an officer is working and is available to be assigned tasks. Officers can be brought on duty by a dispatcher or when they log onto Officer Mobile.   |
| <b>Operational Zone</b> | A large area within your organization which is further<br>segmented into <b>work zones</b> . For example, an operational<br>zone could be the East Campus of a university, and the<br>Cafeteria, Laboratory, and Library are the work zones.  |
| Organization            | An organization that was involved in a dispatch, such as a<br>responding agency (e.g. police or paramedics), organization<br>of interest, or a victim or reporting organization. An<br>organization's involvement can be recorded through an<br><b>Organization Log</b> .                     |
| Person                  | A person who was involved in a dispatch, such as a victim,<br>witness, or reporting person. A person's involvement can be<br>recorded through a <b>Person Log</b> .   |
| Perspective             | A desktop application that helps organizations manage<br>incidents and investigations. When a dispatch is closed, all<br>data from Dispatch and Officer Mobile is moved to<br>Perspective as a new activity record where it can be further<br>analyzed.                                       |
| Priority                | The level of importance assigned to a dispatch (e.g. High,<br>Medium, or Low).  |



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| Push Notification           | A pop-up message or alert on your mobile device to indicate<br>you've received a new message or conversation invitation or<br>you've been assigned a task that is of a higher priority than<br>your current task. Push notifications are sent only when<br>you're not actively working in the app (the app is running in<br>the background), you're logged out, or the app is closed (not<br>running in the background).  |
| Regulated Time to Act (RTA) | Known as an RTA for short, a Regulated Time to Act is a pre-<br>set period that defines how much time an officer has to<br>change his or her status on certain tasks. For example, a<br>High Priority task may have an RTA that requires an officer<br>be On Scene within ten minutes after changing his or her<br>status to On Route.  |
| Single Sign-On (SSO)        | Login authentication that, if configured by a Perspective<br>administrator, stores your login credentials so you can access<br>multiple Resolver desktop applications (Perspective,<br>Dispatch, and Dashboard) without re-entering your login<br>information, as long as your session token (a temporary file<br>that stores your credentials) remains active. For Officer<br>Mobile and Perspective iOS, you can't share your login<br>credentials across apps, however, you don't have to re-enter<br>your credentials while you have an active session token. Note<br>that closing or navigating away from the app does <b>not</b> end<br>your SSO session. To end your session, you must <b>logout</b> . |
| State                       | The current status of an officer which can be changed by a dispatcher or by an officer through the <b>Profile</b> component of Officer Mobile.  |
| Team                        | A group of officers assigned to work in specific <b>work zones</b> .  |
| Work Zone                   | A smaller area within an <b>operational zone</b> (a larger<br>designated area within your organization) that identifies<br>where officers will be working. For example, the East Campus<br>of a university is the operational zone and the Cafeteria,<br>Laboratory, and Library are the working zones within that<br>campus.   |
